2016 Strategic Communications for Policy Change Summit









In Our Own Voice hosted its fabulous *Strategic Communication for Policy Change Summit* for its seven partner organizations last month in Washington, DC. More than 68 staff, board members and activists from our organizational partners came together for five days of strategic planning and collaboration.

The theme this year was "Race in America: Where We (Black Women) Enter" and acclaimed scholar on race, gender and the law, Dorothy Roberts delivered the opening keynote address. For forty-five minutes she gave us a mesmerizing presentation highlighting the roles, context and point of entry for Black women at the intersection of race, gender and reproductive justice in the United States.

Summit participants worked in planning groups around leadership development, advocacy and policy, movement building and joint campaigns to develop the next year's activities for *In Our Own Voice*. Below are photos from the event.
